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HCD – Beneficial or Not?

PROS ("Juha")

- Huge amount of possibilities for new services that originate from everyday activities
- Successful services need to be designed from the people's point of view
- Understanding what users want

How about:

- **Understanding** what users **mean**
- Next level in abstracting the user

CONS ("Gilbert")

- Standard HCD procedures ("210") hinder innovation; "data-bound activities". Delays development, fixed linear order, "waterfall"
- Gould & Lewis 1985 outdated? The context has expanded!
- New concepts: values, **purpose**, social contexts, beneficiaries, worth.
- No C, no D in HCD? Just "H" left?
- Who does D? Is there C in D?

End-User Development / End-User Programming

- *Environments that enable people who are not professional computer programmers to produce working computer applications*
- Increasing users' capabilities – as development platforms evolve
 - Scripting, coding
 - Visual programming
 - Configuring
 - Mashupping
- Empowered user: the designer of the future?
- Designer: facilitator of platforms for emerging uses and flexible solutions?
